Lt Col McNair added “and that’s the newest one.” Lt Col McNair added that there’s an event on May 19th at LeMay Park. Mr. Peterson stated that if he spends an hour or so in each basin, waterfowl will not be around.

Vice Chair Conder stated that on May 24th at 4:00 p.m. the City of Riverside will be re-dedicating its Veteran’s Wall of Heroes. He thanked the JPA for the \$5,000 check that was donated to help complete the project. Vice Chair Conder invited commission members and staff to attend if they are available. He added that if attending, please let the mayor know so they can thank everyone for all the hard work they do. Vice Chair Conder stated that when the JPA does sunset, it should be noted on that Wall of Heroes that they completed their mission of protecting the base.

Member Jeffries stated that he would like to follow along Vice Chair’s concept of sunseting the JPA, and as the saying goes, “no good deed goes unpunished.” He added that as the sticky details start to unfold, he would like to bring the topic of winding down the JPA back to Commission. As it gets more and more complicated, it is his personal opinion that in addition to working on the details of the winding down of the JPA, its finances, how to disburse and get rid of the bond and pension debt, that they should also look at an agreement on an annexation in advance and not wait until they’ve all walked away from the JPA and have no reason to work together. He added that he thinks there is value in trying to work together on the agreed upon annexations before they walk away so they all are held to a common goal, making sure that everyone is being taken care of to the best of their ability, all the respective cities in the county in making sure that the constituents will get the best service possible. He added that at some point when this item stays on the agenda, he feels it is important that they have a discussion about incorporating annexation discussions with all the city representatives in the county and have those offline discussions to see what they can achieve and perhaps put together a dual track so that everything gets conceptually approved so they don’t have to have arguments and all the fun things that go along with LAFCO.

Chair Hewitt stated that he would like to throw a shout out to March JPA Director, Dr. Martin for speaking at Wake-Up Moreno Valley at their Chamber of Commerce event. He added that he was in attendance as well as Mayor Gutierrez.

Background:

Since March 2020, in response to the spread of COVID-19 in the State of California, the Governor issued a number of executive orders aimed at containing the COVID-19 virus. Among other things, these orders waived certain requirements of the Brown Act to allow legislative bodies to meet virtually.

Pursuant to the Governor's executive orders, the Commission has been holding virtual meetings during the pandemic in the interest of protecting the health and safety of the public, staff and officials. The Governor's executive order related to the suspension of certain provisions of the Brown Act expired on September 30, 2021. On October 1, 2021, AB 361 went into effect. AB 361 allows legislative bodies to meet virtually under relaxed rules provided there is a state of emergency, and either: (1) state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing; or (2) the legislative body determines by majority vote that meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees.

In order to take advantage of the relaxed teleconferencing rules, the Commission must make these findings within 30 days of teleconferencing for the first time and again every 30 days thereafter.

At the February 28, 2022 TAC meeting, members inquired regarding services provided by the Riverside County Sheriff’s Department that address truck route enforcement within the Meridian business park. The Sheriff’s Department performed the first round of truck route enforcement on January 25 through February 3, 2022. Overall, 29 citations and 5 warnings for truck route violations were issued. Twenty-seven other violations for commercial vehicles were issued. A list of the enforcement actions taken is attached.

Action: **RECEIVE MARCH JPA SUNSET PLANNING UPDATE AND AUTHORIZE STAFF TO TRANSITION FROM INFORMATION GATHERING PHASE TO A FORMAL NEGOTIATION PHASE**

Motion: Receive March JPA Sunset Planning Update and Authorize Staff to Transition from Information Gathering Phase to a Formal Negotiation Phase

On December 22, 2021, the March JPA Commission, at their regularly scheduled meeting, directed staff to develop a 3-year Sunset Plan with the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). In order to meet the Commission’s directive, staff provided a roadmap with a list of topics to be discussed amongst TAC members that would assist in an information gathering phase.

Significant progress has been made in gathering and assessing data associated with the following information:

- 1) Revenues collected in the March JPA area;
- 2) Riverside County’s cost of services;
- 3) Successor Agency Redevelopment Property Tax Trust Fund (RPTTF);
- 4) Contributions reported by member agencies;
- 5) Service costs reported by member agencies.

To proceed to the next phase of sunset planning, member agencies must now transition into a formal negotiation phase. This phase would involve private negotiations of terms among the member agencies, facilitated by March JPA staff. Because this phase will involve detailed negotiations, possible proprietary data sharing, and legal counsel involvement, the TAC is not the ideal place for such discussions. Instead, staff proposes that the Commission authorize the Executive Director to work with member agencies, coordinate meetings as necessary, to draft the following documents for the Commission’s future consideration:

- 1) A Comprehensive Sunsetting Agreement that would address:
 - a. Revenue sharing on an interim or long-term basis between member agencies;
 - b. Terms and timing of annexations;
 - c. Distribution of assets and liabilities;
 - d. Definition of roles in providing municipal services; and
 - e. Possible pay-down of Successor Agency debt.

- 2) An Amendment to the Joint Powers Agreement to address:
 - a. Transfer of Land Use Authority from JPA to a member agency like the county;
and
 - b. The future role of the Airport Authority for compliance with federal agreements
and protection of the Base.

RSG would assist the JPA with collecting information needed and assisting with the presentation of information in both phases; however, they would not be involved in any aspect of annexation terms discussions until July of 2022.
