Mr. Gaul explained that OLDCC, within the Department of Defense, administers the Installation Readiness Program that funds the OLDCC grant received by MIPAA. The grant supports a vulnerability assessment and a joint community-installation tabletop exercise to identify projects that could be funded to strengthen the region's resilience.

Mr. Gaul noted that the Installation Readiness Program complements the Defense Community Infrastructure Program (DCIP), which funds shovel-ready infrastructure projects. In contrast, the Installation Readiness Program is a planning program focused on electric and natural gas infrastructure.

The Tabletop Exercise (TTX) is scheduled for Tuesday, June 16th at 8:30 a.m.

The three core objectives for the TTX

- 1) Develop a common understanding of MIPAA and March ARB critical missions and its role as force projection platform for the Department of War.
- 2) Develop a common understanding of March Airfield's reliance on critical utility infrastructure and community services to support March ARB and MIPAA missions.
- 3) Identify and prioritize threats and vulnerabilities within the Western Riverside community and roleplay contingency response and prevention activities.

The result is to create solutions that are realistic and implementable.

Background

On March 4, 2026, the Commission approved travel and attendance for Commission representatives and staff to participate in the Association of Defense Communities 50th Annual Summit (“ADC50 Summit”) held in Washington, D.C.

From May 11 through May 13, 2026, Commission representative and staff attended the national conference hosted by the Association of Defense Communities (“ADC”). The ADC50 Summit brought together defense community leaders, military officials, elected representatives, and industry stakeholders from across the country to discuss policies, partnerships, and initiatives supporting military installations, military families, and surrounding communities.

Key topics highlighted during the conference included military mission sustainment; community partnerships through tools such as Defense Critical Infrastructure Program (DCIP) and Intergovernmental Support Agreement (IGSA); and emerging federal priorities impacting defense communities nationwide.

Background

The following is an overview of the current projects at the March Inland Port Airport.

Riverside Sheriff Aviation Hangar Project:

The applicant, Riverside County Sheriff Office, is proposing the development of a two-story 20,000 square foot maintenance, repair and operations (MRO) hangar for 4 aircraft and associated parking lot. The hangar would include a maintenance storage area for parts, paint booth, and welding booth. Dual cranes are needed to work on the aircraft. 10 offices and 20 workstations are proposed in an open area for 30 staff. The Hangar would include a small breakroom, restrooms with lockers for men and women and a small workout area. Parking is proposed in two areas – at hangar entrance and separate parking lot to the north. Security fencing is proposed around both the hangar and parking lot.

The project entitlements would include a Zone Change, Tentative Parcel Map, Plot Plan, Ground Lease and environmental review.

Status: This project is currently on hold while the Sheriff Office waits to receive funding to cover the entitlement review costs.

Fuel Farm Expansion Project:

On September 21, 2005, the March Joint Powers Commission entitled the MIPAA Fuel Farm Project and certified its associated EIR (SCH# 2005041076) for the phased development of six (6) aboveground storage tanks (AST) with a capacity of 630,000 gallons and two (2) 2,500 barrel (BBL) of Jet-A fuel. The initial development consisted of the construction of two (2) AST's 30 feet high and 25 feet in diameter with a combined total capacity of 210,000 gallons of Jet-A fuel and the two (2) 2,500 barrel (BBL). The final build out would consist of the construction of four (4) 105,000-gallon API 650 field erected AST's with a common secondary containment structure.

Status: 30% construction drawings are in review by all implementing agencies (ie. Riv. Co. Fire, Building and Safety, March Air Reserve Base, Riv Co. Env. Health and Hazardous Materials Division, etc...). Staff is working through permit modifications with SCAQMD and RWQCB. Construction drawings will be submitted for plan check September 2026.

RIV Rapid Refuel Proposal:

MIPAA's fixed-based operator (FBO), Million Air, would like to offer rapid refueling. Rapid refuel is the process of refueling an aircraft while its engines are running. Only military aircraft are rapid refueled. To become a rapid refueler the military officially requests rapid refuel capability at our airport, the location is inspected by a Defense Logistics Agency – Energy (DLA- E) Quality Assurance Representative (QAR), and the capability is approved and added to the contract by the DLA-E Contracting Officer (CO). Only personnel qualified in rapid refuel are authorized to conduct rapid refuel operations. Training is required and conducted initially, annually, at the beginning of each contract period, and as required when changes are necessary. Other requirements include signage, aircraft clearances, lighting, fire extinguishers, and safety specifications, etc...

Metrea Headquarters Re-location Update:

Metrea's KC-135R aircraft delivers contract air-to-air refueling services across a wide range of military training exercises. On October 15, 2025, the Joint Powers Commission approved a Sublease Consent for Metrea Strategic Mobility to move their headquarters to MIPAA and occupy an existing 106,430 square foot air cargo facility and have preferential use of (5) aircraft parking spots at 17101 Heacock Street, Moreno Valley, CA 92551.

Status: Tenant improvements are in progress with anticipated occupancy by November 2026.

Master Drainage Plan:

Over the years, MIPAA properties have been developed without a comprehensive understanding of overall drainage. MIPAA is now working with a consultant to map existing drainage facilities and other utilities (ie. electrical, gas, water/sewer, etc...) In time, MIPAA would like to connect its drainage to the Nandina Lateral that runs east/west at the intersection of Heacock St and Nandina Ave.

Perris Valley Lateral B, Stage 6 Project:

The project consists of a master planned storm drain improvement project along the west side of I-215 freeway, south of Van Buren Boulevard, and adjacent to the Riverside National Cemetery. The existing project site consists of a drainage ditch with disturbed vegetation and developed land cover. The ditch conveys flows south to an existing culvert at the RCTC Railroad right-of-way. Flows are then conveyed east underneath the railroad and into an earthen median where an existing Caltrans culvert picks up the flow and conveys it directly into Perris Valley Channel Line B. Once constructed, the proposed project would provide a direct connection of Perris Valley Channel Line B from the Van Buren culvert to the RCTC culvert at the termination of the project site.

The project would construct the last leg of the Perris Valley Lateral B project. Specifically, it would consist of an underground 6-foot by 4-foot reinforced concrete box (RCB) from an existing 6-foot by 3-foot RCB at Van Buren Boulevard, extending approximately 2,350 linear feet south and connecting to existing dual 48-inch reinforced concrete pipes at the RCTC railroad right-of-way.

The project entitlements include an environmental review and a Cooperative Agreement between March JPA, Flood Control and the developer (Meridian Park, LLC.).

Status: The Cooperative Agreement is in review by all parties. The environmental review is in its final stages of peer review. It is anticipated that this project will go to the Joint Powers Commission on October 7, 2026.

Airport Policies and Procedures Update:

Staff is updating the Airport Policies and Procedures Manual and Airport Emergency Operations Plan to ensure both documents accurately reflect current airport operations and industry best practices.

The updates will include revisions to operational procedures, the addition of rapid refueling procedures, updates to emergency contact information, and revisions to the Emergency Operations Plan to ensure emergency response protocols remain current and coordinated with applicable agencies.

Background

In August of 2025, the March Inland Port Airport Authority (MIPAA), in partnership with the March Air Reserve Base and regional stakeholders, was awarded an OLDCC grant in the amount of Six Hundred and Fifty Thousand and One Hundred and Fifty Seven Dollars (\$650,157) to assess the resilience of natural gas, electricity, and related communications infrastructure supporting MARB, MIPAA, and the surrounding community, and providing prioritized recommendations for improvements to address any vulnerabilities identified.

The project is to help identify critical infrastructure resilience improvements to ensure a fourteen (14) day off-grid operational capability in the event of natural disasters, infrastructure failures, or manmade threats. On June 16th, MIPAA hosted its required Table Top Exercise (TTX) at the Target facility on MIPAA property.
